A Note on the Wholesale Price Index in 1960-61

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In this note an attempt is made to extend the wholesale price index prepared in the Institute of Development Economics¹ to 1960-61. That index, which was computed for the East and West wings separately and for the whole of Pakistan, covered a period of nine years from 1951-52 to 1959-60 (July-June) with 1951-52 as the base year. The West Pakistan index covers 35 commodities while the commodities included in East Pakistan index number 25. The weights for each wing are derived from the net quantity available to final users in each year. It should be remembered that this wholesale price index is not an all-purpose general price index; its coverage and scope are limited. It is a measure of annual wholesale price changes for certain goods in East and in West Pakistan. Further details of the index may be found in the monograph cited in footnote1. The present index for 1960-61 is computed by the Laspeyres formula alone as it was not possible to calculate the Paasche index without information on quantities available during 1960-61.2 For the same reason it is not possible to extend the analysis of quantity indices previously presented for both wings of Pakistan.3

The Laspeyres index weights prices by the quantity in the base year and therefore is not influenced by a change in weights. However, since the structure of the economy has changed since 1951-52, the weights have undergone significant changes. This is particularly the case in West Pakistan where, for instance, wheat has declined in weight from 37 per cent in 1951-52 to 28 per cent in 1959-60 while the weight of cloth has risen from 2 per cent to 9 per cent over the same period. To reduce the bias caused by such changes, the index for 1960-61 is prepared using 1959-60 weights as well as 1951-52 weights.

The following table shows the price indices for 1960-61 as compared to the preceding two years.

The East Pakistan index for 1960-61 shows a decline of 4.6 per cent over the preceding year in terms of both 1951-52 quantities and 1959-60 quantities. This is explained by the abnormally high and practically unchanging weight of one single commodity, rice.⁴ The fall in the index reflected lower prices of rice which declined 7.4 per cent. This movement serves, however, to conceal significant increases in the price of most other items, notably raw sugar and tobacco.

The West Pakistan index, on the other hand, increased by 10.6 per cent during 1960-61 and attained its highest level over (133.4 with 1951-52 base and weights). The increase reflected presumably the impact of decontrol of wheat and rice which more than offset a fall in prices of a few other commodities, particularly maize (17 per cent) and coal (7 per cent). Prices of wheat rose by 24 per cent and of most of the other agricultural commodities also increased. In terms of 1959-60 weights, however, the index showed a rise of only 9.5 per cent during 1960-61. Appendices A and B show the prices of all the commodities in 1959-60 and 1960-61 in West and East Pakistan respectively.

Several mistakes were detected after the publication of Monograph No. 4. These have since been corrected.⁵ As a result, the West Pakistan Paasche index for 1958-59 and 1959-60 now stands at 111.2 and 118.2, respectively. The Fisher "Ideal" is consequently changed, for these years, to 114.1 and 119.7 for West Pakistan and to 115.9 and 121.7 for All Pakistan. These figures should be accordingly corrected in the monograph. The changes do not significantly affect the analysis or conclusions of that study.
