

The cost of first and last mile travel significantly impact overall commuting expenses, leading to reliance on personal vehicles or walking. Commuters prefer modes that offer a balance between affordability, efficiency, comfort and safety. Lack of integrated and inclusive system limit their choices, often pushing them toward more expensive or less safe alternative. Various factors such as mode choice, cost, time, distance, accessibility, infrastructure, safety and comfortability affect the mode choice behavior of commuters. Transportation gaps for PWDs and transgender leading to reduced mobility, and social isolation.

The Research for Social Transformation and Advancement (RASTA) Competitive Grants Programme for Policy-Oriented Research (CGP) Project is the largest economics and public policy research grants programme in Pakistan – establishing an extensive knowledge network – producing high-quality, evidence-based policy research. Initiated in July 2020 for 36 months (July 2020 to June 2025) against the total cost of Rs. 1,756 million, its network includes +65 local universities, +12 foreign institutes, & around +3,200 researchers, academics, practitioners, & professionals.

The objectives of the RASTA program are to: (a) Reduce the research-policy gap by stimulating economic and social science research and debate across Pakistan; (b) Build a network to stimulate internally defined and produced policy-relevant research; (c) Provide a knowledge-sharing platform where different actors can present and share evidence-based research to inform decision-making in the government; (d) Revisit the future policy agenda in line with the evidence produced in this program; and (e) Build capacity and improve policymaking and implementation by involving and engaging local universities, think tanks, policymakers, practitioners, and other stakeholders. The programme is guided by the following 27 members Research Advisory Committee (RAC), chaired by the Vice-Chancellor, PIDE Islamabad.



The RASTA programme has two broad streams through which it is building research networks, funding research projects, and informing public policy in Pakistan: the Competitive Grants Programme (CGP) and the Demand-Driven Research (DDR). Under CGP, research proposals are invited on specific themes/topics decided by the Research Advisory Committee, followed by a rigorous three-stage double-blind review process and announcement of awards. DDR programme is a pro-active evidence-based research approach to inform governments' policy-making processes. The final output of CGP & DDR projects is in the form of books, research reports, journal articles and working papers and policy briefs. The final output of CGP & DDR projects is published in the form of books, reports, journal articles, working papers & policy briefs which are disseminated nationwide through events. Impact of the project include: capacity building of local researchers, networking, & provision of research for informed policy.

CGP Round 3.0

In the third round, 02 research projects out of 79 research applications (233 applicants) were awarded research grants (worth of Rs. 5.3 million). The round has been closed.

CGP Round 4.0

In the fourth round, 17 research projects out of 187 research applications (537 applicants) were awarded research grants (worth of Rs. 38.5 million). Draft working papers of all projects were presented in the third RASTA Conference and can be accessed from the link:
