INSTRUCTION FOR LISTING NAMES IN THE ROSTER

- Ask the names of all the members of the immediate family, who live and eat their meals together in the dwelling.
- Ask the names of any other person related to the head of the household or to his/her spouse as well as their children who normally live and eat their meals in the dwelling.
- Ask the names of any other persons related to the head of the household and his/her spouse who are not present but who normally live and eat their meals in the dwelling, e.g., any person away for studying or on vacation, or who is visiting other place.
- Ask names of any other persons who are not present, but who has either a spouse or children living and eating in the household.
- Ask names of any persons not related to the head or his/her spouse but who normally live and eat in the dwelling, e.g., tenants, servants, guests, etc.,

- Write the names of each person in capital letters.

- Always write the name of the head of the household first, followed by his/her spouse and their unmarried children in order of age.
- If there is more than one wife, start with the first wife followed by her children in order of age, the second wife and her children and so on.
- Write the names of married children of the head of household, their spouses and offsprings.
- As you list the names of all persons (Q1) note down their sex, age and relationship to the head in Q2- Q4.
- Ask Q5 to Q12 for each person completing the entire line before moving to the next person.
- If spouse/father/mother is not in the roster write '99', and if father/mother are not alive write '98' in Q8 and Q9.

FILLING THE Q 11: Criteria for Being the Household Member

Look at the response to Q10- how long is the stay?

- All persons for whom the answer is 9 months or less are classified as household members, excluding persons like guests, servants, hired workers or lodgers.

- If the answer is more than 9 months in Q10, the following persons would still be members:
 - i. The head of the household
 - ii. Infants less the 3 months
 - iii. Persons working abroad/elsewhere in the country whose spouse and/or children are living in the dwelling or those who are unmarried and intend to return.
 - iv. Students studying/living elsewhere but supported by the household.
- Apart from the cases listed above, all other persons for whom the answer is more than 9 months are not household members.

Enter code 1 for each household member and code 2 for all other persons in Q 11
