their meals together in the dwelling.

his/her spouse as well as their children who normally live and eat their meals in the

his/her spouse who are not present but who normally live and eat their meals in the
dwelling, e.g., any person away for studying or on vacation, or who is visiting other
place.
☐ Ask names of any other persons who are not present, but who has either a spouse
or children living and eating in the household.
☐ Ask names of any persons not related to the head or his/her spouse but who
