Life of street vendors have never been easy in Pakistan, but indeed in most of the jurisdictions across the world, especially in developing countries. Despised by the state and society elite, street vendors are constrained to operate in a continuous environment of fear and uncertainty on account of eviction. Any judicial and administrative relief are far and few and have usually proved to be short-lived for street vendors. Buoyed by the elite support and prevalent prejudice against street vendors, any administrative move, for the removal of street vendors from the public space, has relatively remained a smooth affair. Persistent repression has created its own survival dynamics among the street vendor community. They have worked out their space in the ecosystem through bribery to city administration and often with collective action of protest or buying-in of local power brokers. Its sustenance depends upon the resilience of their negotiation skill in an unequal power equation with city regulators. Question of the day remains about the modus operandi of settling or unsettling of street vendors in public spaces of urban Pakistan.



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("MoU") is entered into by and between:

Poverty Alleviation & Social Safety Division, Government of Pakistan, with its office at Evacuee Trust Complex, Islamabad, through Mr. Muhammad Ali Shahzada, Secretary, Poverty Alleviation & Social Safety, (hereinafter referred to as "PASSD") of the First Part;

Capital Development Authority, Government of Pakistan, with its office at Khayaban-e-Subarwardi, Islamahad, through Mr. Amer Ali Ahmed, Chairman, Capital Development Authority, (hereinafter referred to as "CDA") of the Second Part;

Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) Administration, with its office at ICT Administration Complex, Islamabad, through Mr. Amer Ali Ahmed, Chief Commissioner, ICT Administration, (hereinafter referred to as "ICTA") of the Third Part;

Metropolitan Corporation Islamabad, with its office at Mayor Office (Old Naval Headquarters), Islamabad, through Sveda Shafaq Hashmi, Administrator, Metropolitan Corporation Islamabad, (hereinafter referred to as "MCI") of the Fourth Part;

Pakistan Institute of Development Economics, with its office at Quaid-e-Azam University campus, Islamabad, through Dr. Nadeem-ul-Hague, Vice Chancellor, Pakistan Institute of Development Economics, (hereinafter referred to as "PIDE") of the Fifth Part;

(PASSD, CDA, ICTA, MCI and PIDE are hereinafter individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties")

PREAMBLE

It is a matter of fact that despite existence of legal framework to regulate business of street vendors, neither their rights are effectively protected nor is their business operations regulated efficiently. This state of affairs not only supports nepotism, but also encourages unhealthy business practices.

Thus, a need is felt that various stakeholders join hands to provide due assistance in regulating business of street vendors by creating synergies in their respective legal



HAWKER / VENDOR LICENSE ISSUED UNDER ERSAAS REHRIBAAN PROGRAM AT DESIGNATED SPOT IN SECTOR G-10 MARKAZ, ISLAMABAD.

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed on 4th March 2021 between Poverty

Alleriation & Social Safety Division (PASSD), Metropolitas Corporation Islamabad (MCI), Capital Development Authority (CDA), ICT Administration (ICTA) and Pakistan Institute of Development Economics (PIDE) for Street Vendors' Initiative.

In the light of street vendors' survey, conducted by PIDE under the EHSAAS REHRIBAAN PROGRAM, Metropolium Corporation Islamabad, the Competent Authority has been pleased to great you a hawker / vendor license for the period of 1-year, effective from the above-mentioned issue date. It allows you Street Vending of Legal Products/ Services on the pre-approved design modular and ecofriendly vending cart, measuring 6 × 3 feet in dimensions, at a designated spot in Sector G-10 Marker blamshad subject to payment of hawker / vendor license for @ Rs.2,000/- per month under Clause (xi) Section 1 Islamshed Capital Territory, Municipal Bye-Laws, 1968 as well as Local Covernment Act, 2015, with following terms and conditions:

- i. Submission of complete requisite documentation of the above license holder including duly filled vending license form, undertaking on Ra 100 stamp paper pertaining to source of livelihood, copies of CNIC and Family Registration Certificate, 2 × passport-size photographs, police verification report and pay order amounting Rs.24,000/- for 1-year advance vendor license for by U Microfinance Bank Islamabad meanding grant of hawker / vendor license is hereby acknowledged.
 - You shall run your business of street vending from the designated spot only
- You shall not be allowed to move your cart from the designated spot to anywhere else until and unless the Competent Authority may order for its shifting.
- You shall not affix or exhibit or permit to install the exterior of the external wells of the cart there of any posters, signboard or other advertisement without approval of the
- In case, it was found out that you have rented out the cert at the designated spot to anyone else, your vendor license shall stand cancelled without any notice and shall be given to next deserving / needly person.
- vi. The vendor license is non-transferrable, you shall be allowed to engage one of your family members as mentioned in the NADRA-issued Family Registration Certificate (FRC) for

Challenges

Removal of Irregular Vendors

Influx of new vendors are coming in the area covered, where DMA has to establish its writ with timely eviction campaigns

Scaling is Slow

Number of microfinance banks are less, as processing takes time; structural issues like convincing street vendors

Status Quo Resistance

Program is facing implicit & explicit resistance from market associations & other elements, despite efforts on awareness
